Stranger Danger

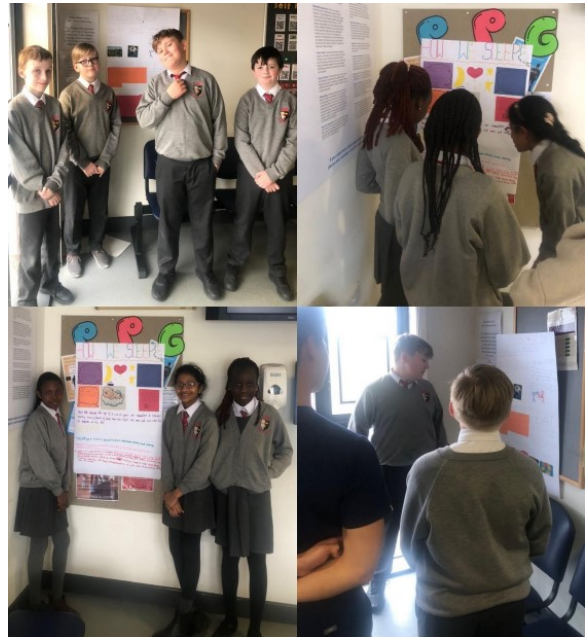
Please remind your child to be aware of potential dangers from strangers on the way to and from school.

- Skills will include -**
- Recognising the sounds that each individual letter makes.
 - Identifying the sounds that different combinations of letters make - such as 'sh' or 'oo'.
 - Blending these sounds together from left to right to make a word.
 - Children can then use this knowledge to 'decode' new words that they hear or see.

For more advanced users

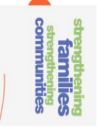
If you've learned the basics and would now like to know more or if you have good IT skills but have no proof of your ability, in the form of a certificate, then working towards an ICDL qualification is for you.

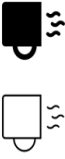

Prayer and Liturgy

Jesus is Risen! Jesus is Alive!

*God raised him from the dead,
for many days he appeared to those
who are now his witnesses to the people.*

Easter Sunday is an important day for Christians as it is the day that Jesus was resurrected to take away the darkness of evil. A typical celebration takes place in a church which is filled with candles that represent Jesus as the light of the world and also flowers, which symbolise a new life. By dying, Jesus showed Christians that death was nothing to fear. If they believe in God and ask for forgiveness for their sins, they will have a new life in heaven when they die.

After Jesus had been crucified, his body was taken off of the cross and placed in a tomb cut out of rock. They wrapped Jesus' body in a shroud, placed it in the tomb and rolled a huge stone in front of the entrance to the tomb. A Roman soldier guarded the tomb. Nearby stood the women who followed Jesus; among them was Mary Magdalene, who had travelled with Jesus through Galilee ever since Jesus had healed her. The women watched somberly as a huge stone was rolled across the entrance of the tomb.

Jesus had been betrayed and denied, and now he lay in a tomb – but that wasn't the end of the story . . .

The next day was the Sabbath: a day of rest in the midst of festivities. The following day – the third day after Jesus' death – something very strange happened.

That morning, as the sun rose, Mary Magdalene and the other women returned to the tomb with spices to anoint Jesus' body. The crunching of their feet broke the stillness of the morning and the air was threaded with the scent of blossom.

As they entered the garden, a sight greeted the women that made them stop in their tracks . . . Inside the tomb they saw an angel. 'Do not be afraid,' said the angel, 'Jesus has risen as he said he would.' The women rushed from the tomb, full of joy, to tell the disciples what they had seen and from there, the news spread all over Jerusalem.
